When asked to describe the job she was performing in the above photo, this is what she said: *"I am right above the wheel, which on a locomotive is a big DC motor. There is a little magnet head that sticks into a hole on the motor and counts the gear teeth. Therefore it makes an AC voltage and tells you what speed the motor is going. We need to know this because if the motor locks up and starts sliding, the rails will warp and the train will wreck. I have my head under there trying to put a ty-wrap on the rest of the slack so that the flange of the wheel doesn't cut it in half."*
